Newbury Park High School operates on a block schedule. Students earn full credit (10 units) for each class taken during the block periods. A typical student will earn 30 units of credit for Term 1 (September – February), and 30 units of credit for Term 2 (February – June). In addition, some students take one or two classes such as Band, Journalism, Student Government, etc., before or after the regular block periods. Students earn 5 units per term for each of these specialty classes. Students also have the option of taking an academic class such as English, math, or social science (CP level only) during period 1. Students must attend these classes for both Term 1 and Term 2 to earn the full credit. Period 1 academic classes are strictly optional to provide flexibility in students' schedules for those who need it. The basic grading scale may vary for individual teachers, but the norm is:
